With the passing of the Go Get Organized Resolution, a budget that includes \$5,000 for organizing, and a plan laid out for that purpose, the Officers of AFSCME Michigan Retiree Chapter 255 are already moving forward with the organizing effort. May we all work together to reach a goal that one day all of the Regional Board positions for our retiree chapter will be filled to include representation across the entire State of Michigan.

Detroit Senior Housing Centers – Ed McNeil has been visiting senior complexes in Detroit and found as many as 7 AFSCME retirees in each building he has visited to date. He will continue in this effort to organize members of SubChapter 98.

Contact with Sam Zettner in Region 3 – Kathie Sherrill has been in contact regarding organizing members in Region 3 and had positive interest from Sam. He will be reaching out to her in 2026.

Staff Meetings in Detroit and Lansing – We spoke with Gino Carbenia, Executive Director of AFSCME Michigan 925, at our Convention Reception. Gino has agreed to offer assistance with organizing retiree members by possibly providing funds and/or VMO's, to be determined later. He has given us permission to meet with Staff around the state to introduce our chapter and talk about what we do and he supports our vision to meet with active locals as well. These meetings can be done in person or virtually.

We met with Staff in the Detroit office on Friday, December 5th. Attorneys from Bruce Miller's office also attended. We were well received by all and they are on board with getting the word out to their locals. We signed up one new member at the meeting in Detroit and another took two membership signup cards home to have his mother and father sign up. We hope to attend Local meetings and events in these regions in 2026.

We met with the Director and Staff in the Lansing office on Monday, December 8th and, again, were well received. They are excited and committed to helping us organize retirees.
